## Int.B. Definition of Subspecialty

Female pelvic medicine and reconstructive surgery <u>Urogynecology and</u> reconstructive pelvic surgery physicians provide specialized services and comprehensive management of women with pelvic floor disorders. Comprehensive management includes the preventive, diagnostic, and therapeutic procedures necessary for the total care of the female patient, including complications and sequelae resulting from pelvic floor disorders.

- Describe the Review Committee's rationale for this revision: The American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) and the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) have changed the name of the subspecialty from female pelvic medicine and reconstructive surgery to urogynecology and reconstructive pelvic surgery. The name is therefore being adapted accordingly for the ACGME subspecialty and all applicable requirements.
- How will the proposed requirement or revision improve resident/fellow education, patient safety, and/or patient care quality?
   The change will provide consistency between the certifying boards and the ACGME.
